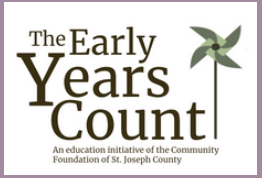


# Play Schemas: The secret to understanding repeated patterns of behavior in infants and toddlers
